Learning Together, Growing Stronger

A new year is a perfect time to begin teaching kids about setting goals! Teaching your child to set goals can not only help them take responsibility, but also helps foster a positive "can-do" attitude and increases self-esteem.

Each 4-H member should take this time to write down their goals for each of their projects. IF you don't have a plan (goals), it is difficult for you to GROW in your project areas. Every 4-H'er should write at least 3 goals per project area. A good rule of thumb is to write your initial three goals and then add one more goal for every year you have been in the project. Example: if you have been in the Beef project for 5 years, you should be able to write 8 goals. These goals should include project learning goals, leadership goals, and citizenship goals. What do you need to purchase, and what events do you need to attend to achieve these objectives? This resource can help you write your project goals

Composition and framing


- <u>Plain background</u>: Use a simple, uncluttered background to keep the focus on your subject.
- <u>Rule of thirds</u>: Avoid placing your subject directly in the center. Instead, use the grid to position it along the lines or at the intersections for more compelling shots.
- <u>Frame your shot</u>: Use elements like doorways, branches, or arches to create a natural frame around your subject.
- <u>Change perspectives</u>: Don't always shoot from eye level. Try getting low to the ground or looking from a higher vantage point.

Camera and lighting techniques

- <u>Use flash outdoors</u>: A flash can fill in harsh shadows caused by direct sunlight, preventing dark, unclear faces.
- <u>Move in close</u>: Get closer to your subject to fill the frame and capture more detail.
- <u>Lock the focus</u>: If your camera allows, lock the focus on your subject so it doesn't shift when you recompose your shot.
- <u>Watch the light</u>: Pay attention to the direction and quality of light to avoid harsh shadows or silhouettes, unless that's the effect you want.

K-State Junior Producer Days

The 2026 K-State Junior Producer Days have been scheduled. The dates are provided below. We host two junior producer days each year, with beef and sheep in even years and swine and meat goat in odd years. So, we will be hosting a junior beef and sheep producer day next spring. These are one-day, educational events focused on a specific species for families, extension agents, and ag teachers to learn about the selection and management of youth livestock projects. All ages and skill levels are invited to attend!

Registration information will be released in the next few weeks. Once released, updates will be emailed to those on the YLP listserv, posted on the youth livestock program Facebook page, as well as added to the junior producer days page of youth livestock program website, which is under the events tab.

Kansas 4-H Horse Judging Contest

Kansas 4-H, Kansas Quarter Horse Association, and EquiFest of Kansas are teaming up to host the 2026 Kansas State 4-H Horse Judging Contest. The Contest will be held January 23, 2026, in conjunction with EquiFest of Kansas in Topeka. Two contests are available- an open contest and a 4-H contest. Kansas 4-H members age 9-18 are invited to participate in the 4-H contest, and may also participate in the open contest. Youth of any age are eligible to participate in the open contest hosted by Kansas Quarter Horse Association. Cost to enter the 4-H contest is \$25. Registration for the open contest is \$15. Coaches should register teams and individuals here. Earlybird registration closes January 2nd; late registration is available until January 9th. Registration will NOT be taken the day of the contest.

Japan Exchange Host Families Needed

Families looking for a new experience for summer 2026? Host a Japanese delegate in the comforts of your own home while exploring the world. Thirty teens from Japan are needing host families this summer. The Japanese delegate will be in Kansas from July 21 to August 16, but families are needed for hosting from July 23 to August 15. Host families are needed who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl. The Japanese youth will be between the ages of 12 and 16. Our responsibility is to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other.

Any Kansas family with children aged 9-17 who is interested in the Japanese culture may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money for souvenirs. They can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is on everyday family life as the delegate becomes part of your family. The delegates' information is to be available in February 2026.

Knitting and Crocheting

Project Talk and Demonstration Training

Public Speaking is one life skill that 4-H prides itself on. Each 4-H member should learn public speaking and perform a Project Talk or Demonstration once a year at a 4-H meeting. I will host a Project Talk and Demonstration Training on Tuesday, December 30th at the Ness County Fairgrounds. This will be a great opportunity for you to learn and get started on a presentation for District 4-H Club Days.

District 4-H Club Days

District 4-H Club Days is a public speaking contest where 4-H members can perform individually, with a partner or as a club. Club Days includes Show and Tell, Project Talks, Demonstrations, Illustrated Talks, Public Speaking, Digital Presentations, Extemporaneous, CRI - Cover Letter, Resume and Interview, Music, Readings, Skits, and Dance.

District 4-H Club Days will be held Saturday, February 21st at the Ness City High School. Registration and more information will be coming soon.

Regional 4-H Club Days will be at the Nazarene Church in Dodge City on Saturday, March 7^{th} , for any 4-Her that receives TOP Blue at District 4-H Club Days.

Recipe of the Month: Easy Egg and Sausage Casserole

Gather the following ingredients and supplies for this activity.

- 1 pound sausage (chicken or pork)
- 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- 2 slices whole wheat bread, cubed

6 eggs

- 1 cup milk
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1. Brown sausage and drain. Toss with cheese and bread.
- 2. Pour into a greased shallow baking dish (9x13)
- 3. Beat eggs, milk, salt, and pepper. Pour over sausage mixture.
- 4. Refrigerate overnight or at least 6 hours.
- 5. Bake at 350 for about 45 minutes.
