## POSITION DESCRIPTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES

4-H Ambassadors work together with a team of approximately 3-8 Ambassadors and an adult advisor to develop a public information program for the county/district 4-H Program. Family and Community Wellness includes Clothing and Textiles, Family Studies, Fiber Arts, Foods and Nutrition Health and Wellness, and Home Environment

- Provide volunteer lead leadership for educational programming related to 4-H family and community wellness.
- Share responsibility for the 4-H youth development programming related to family and community wellness.
- Share responsibility for community vitality programming that helps our communities become better places to live, work, and play. Programming will strengthen social, civic, economic, and technological capacity of communities through leadership development and civic engagement.
- Ambassador Work will include these steps:
  - Writing articles of educational information for Family & Community Wellness 4-H Projects
  - Promoting 4-H FCW projects through radio and television
  - Serving as a Junior Leaders to a 4-H FCW Project

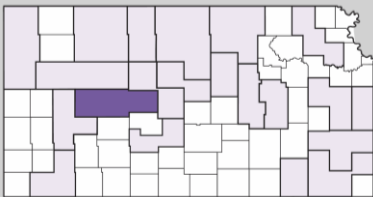
